#### **Highlights of Reoccurring Committee Meetings:**

### 1) IT Strategic Planning Committee

 Mr. Carlos Lobato interim Chief information office highlighted that cybersecurity threats to campus continue to be of high concern – people should not let their guard down over the holidays

#### 2) University System Budget Committee

- Information from NMSU Government relations personnel indicates that the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) is thinking of a proposed 6% salary increase for faculty and staff with some potential for additional funds for targeted faculty salary increases
- LFC has strongly indicated that they are not receptive to individual state funded higher learning institutions making requests for salary increases
- Board of Regents plans to actively advocate for salary increases for NMSU faculty –
   Faculty Senate Budget and Resources committee putting together a one page of talking points for the regents
- Very large state budget surplus (~3.4 billion) over last year
