Whereas, as a member of the NMSU Faculty Senate for several years, chair of Faculty Senate from 2009-2010, and vice-chair in 2008, Chris Erickson was dedicated to serving his department, college, and university and advancing shared governance at NMSU.

Whereas, as parliamentarian of the NMSU Faculty Senate for seven years, Chris Erickson represented the best of the values of service, leadership, and fairness.

Whereas, as a dedicated leader, Chris Erickson has served (and continues to serve) as an Interim department head in the Economics, Applied Statistics, and International Business department, for 4 years.

Whereas, as a contributor to the economic education of the public, Chris Erickson has published weekly articles in the Las Cruces Bulletin. These articles have made current events and the

economics surrounding them, more accessible to people of Las Cruces. Chris was also editor of the New Mexico Business Outlook from 2003 to 2013.

Whereas, as a leader in political issues, Chris Erickson was recognized as a Domenici Fellow in 2012.

Whereas, as a faculty member who believes in the importance of ethical decisions and outcomes, Chris Erickson was named a Daniel Fellows in 2011 and 2013.

Whereas, reflecting his concern for quality teaching, Chris Erickson was awarded the College of Business Faculty Graduate Teaching Award in 2011. He has also served as a mentor and chair of many Doctorate of Economic Development projects.

Whereas, as someone who cares about the environment, Chris Erickson has published widely on topics dealing with algae for use as a biofuel, solar distillation of ethanol, and development of commercial community forestry projects.

Whereas, as a leader in the field of economic development at the local, regional, and national levels, Chris Erickson was named the recipient of the Garrey E. and Katherin T. Carruthers Endowed Chair in Economic Development in 2020.

Whereas, Chris Erickson's devotion to service to students, faculty, administrators, the public, and friends at New Mexico State University has driven and defined his career at NMSU;

Let it be resolved on this 6th day of May 2021, that the NMSU Faculty Senate celebrates Chris Erickson and his extensive contributions to New Mexico State University and the State of New Mexico.
