Whereas, in 2019 the state of New Mexico designated the second Monday in October as Indigenous People's Day;

And whereas, in the 2018-2019 academic year, the NMSU Faculty Senate successfully passed Proposition 8/2018-2019, which was signed as approved by then-president John Floros and then-Provost April Mason;

And whereas, Proposition 8/2018-2019 directed the following action items:

- acknowledging and embracing Indigenous Peoples' ceremonies and events
- hosting outstanding Indigenous speakers or a speaker's series
- highlighting student and faculty research, etc.
- asserting that the University's campuses, centers, and offices are on the traditional territories and ancestral lands of Indigenous Peoples of Chihene Nde', Mescalero Apache, Lipan Apache, Raramuri, Ysleta Del Sur, Tortugas Pueblo, Piro, Manso, Tewa People, the Aztecs of the North, Navajo Nation, Laguna Pueblo, Acoma Pueblo, Zuni Pueblo, Sandia Pueblo, Isleta Pueblo
- Create initiatives to target the recruitment, retention, and success of Indigenous students, staff, and faculty.

And whereas, the university has failed to uphold its promise to fund and host speakers, highlight student and faculty research, approve a land acknowledgement statement, or fund initiatives to recruit, retain and mentor to success Indigenous students, staff, and faculty;

And whereas the Provost has announced that he is working to make NMSU a Native-Serving (non-tribal) institution;

And whereas, the Provost and the VP of DEI have asserted that it is the faculty's responsibility alone to provide programming, despite the absence of targeted funding;

Therefore, the Faculty Senate of New Mexico State University calls on the university administration strongly to advocate for funding for these promised initiatives in the 2024 legislative session.

Proposal: NMSU Annual Recognition of Indigenous Peoples' Day on the 2nd Monday of October

New Mexico State University will recognize Indigenous Peoples' Day on the second Monday in October. While the University remains open, it will commemorate Indigenous Peoples' Day in many ways such as acknowledging and embracing Indigenous Peoples' ceremonies and events, hosting outstanding Indigenous speakers or a speaker's series, highlighting student and faculty research, etc.

This recognition will be entered on the University Academic Calendar webpage.

Rationale:

Notably, the University and its five campuses, the satellite learning center in Albuquerque, its Cooperative Extension Service offices located in each of New Mexico's 33 counties, and 12 agriculture research and science centers, sit on Indigenous Peoples' land. As well, the University has a long history of enrolling, educating, and employing Indigenous Peoples of the Americas.

The purpose of Indigenous Peoples' Day will be to:

 Honor all that Indigenous Peoples bring to the University through their ways of being, languages, arts and other cultural displays, knowledges, pedagogies (teaching/interacting) and values.

- Sponsor events to educate and bring awareness of the ongoing struggles, contributions, and accomplishments of Indigenous Peoples.
- Assert that the University's campuses, centers, and offices are on the traditional territories and ancestral lands of Indigenous Peoples of Chihene Nde', Mescalero Apache, Lipan Apache, Raramuri, Ysleta Del Sur, Tortugas Pueblo, Piro, Manso, Tewa People, the Aztecs of the North, Navajo Nation, Laguna Pueblo, Acoma Pueblo, Zuni Pueblo, Sandia Pueblo, Isleta Pueblo.
- Create initiatives to target the recruitment, retention, and success of Indigenous students, staff, and faculty.
