Proposal: The Faculty Senate requests that the administration accept the following change to Bill 07-23/24.

Change the original language, "It is highly recommended that funding is sourced from IDC monies. The total fund amount may fluctuate from year to year depending on the fiscal budget but should remain at a minimum of 0.5% of annual NMSU grant funding each year." to "It is highly recommended that funding is sourced from IDC monies. Rationale: The rationale for this proposal is to correct and clarify the difference between 0.5% of IDC, which is the intended amount, vs 0.5% of annual NMSU grant funding. This is needed because of the changes in both the administration and in Faculty Senate. A preliminary internal analysis indicated that 0.5% of IDC recovery is commensurate with faculty needs. By passing this clarification, we address issues brought up by the administration and make planning for future implementation possible.
