Whereas, designation of New Mexico State University as an R1 institution is specifically stated in the NMSU LEADS 2025 strategic plan, and

Whereas, graduate faculty are uniquely qualified to review proposed new (or significantly altered) graduate programs, and

Whereas, the Graduate Council is comprised of faculty elected by the graduate faculty of the University to serve as their representatives,

Therefore, the NMSU Faculty Senate formally requests that the Graduate Dean route all proposals for changes to, or development of, new graduate academic programs to the Graduate Council for full review as part of the approval process.
